SPECIAL DEPUTY RECEIVER'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE WRITTEN RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING CEMETERY

Julie Mix McPeak, Commissioner of the Department of Commerce & Insurance, Receiver for Hawkins County Memorial Gardens (hereafter referred to as "HCMG"), through her appointed Special Deputy Receiver, Receivership Management Inc., hereby moves the Court for an Order extending the April 28, 2017 deadline established in the Court's March 23, 2017 Memorandum and Order for filing written recommendations regarding possible ways to "recover proceeds to fund the Pre-need Services Trusts" of HCMG through the sale of the cemetery. The Special Deputy Receiver requests that the deadline be extended to **May 19, 2017**.

As grounds for this Motion, the Special Deputy Receiver would show the Court the following:

1. As part of the process for formulating the recommendations requested by the Court, the Special Deputy Receiver has instituted a plan of action that includes, *inter alia*, identifying potential purchasers of the cemetery, collecting information regarding those potential purchasers, and communicating with prospective purchasers regarding possible approaches for

implementing a sale of the cemetery, including those mentioned in Paragraph 2 of the Court's March 23 Order.

- During the last few weeks following the Court's Status Conference on March 22, 2017 in the present case, the Special Deputy Receiver has dealt with some unexpected personal family matters and work matters that have forced him to be out of the office and out of town on several occasions. The tasks include work performed as the Special Deputy Receiver for the Galilee Memorial Gardens (located in Memphis, Tennessee) receivership case currently pending in the Chancery Court of Davidson County (Case No. 14-102-II). Accordingly, the Special Deputy Receiver has been unable to complete the investigation necessary for formulating his recommendations regarding HCMG.
- 3. The Special Deputy Receiver submits that a three week extension of the deadline (i.e., extension to May 19, 2017) would give him sufficient time to complete his investigation and file the requested written recommendations with the Court.

WHEREFORE, the Special Deputy Receiver requests that this Motion be granted and that the Court enter an Order extending the deadline for filing its written recommendations regarding HCMG to May 19, 2017.
